MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Richard M. Suchar appeals from the judgment of conviction of the Superior Court (Kennebec County, *Brodrick, J.*) entered following a jury verdict convicting Suchar of criminal trespass (Class E), 17-A M.R.S. § 402(1)(E) (2010). On appeal, Suchar contends that the evidence was insufficient to support the conviction and that, because Suchar styles himself as a sovereign citizen, the State and the court lacked authority to try and convict him of the criminal trespass charge. Review of the record demonstrates that there is sufficient evidence in the record to support each and every element of the trespass charge. *See State v. Chiapetta*, 513 A.2d 831, 833-34 (Me. 1986). Suchar's remaining arguments, including those relating to the court's and the prosecutor's authority to hear and participate in the proceedings, are frivolous. *See State v. Murphy*, 2010 ME 140, ¶ 2, --- A.3d ---, ---.
