MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Charles J. Raybine appeals from the judgment of the Violations Bureau (Biddeford, *Cantara, J.*) finding him to have committed the civil violation of speeding, 29-A M.R.S. § 2073(3) (2010), ten to fourteen miles per hour over the speed limit. Raybine argues that it was not possible for him to be driving forty-one miles per hour in a thirty-mile-per-hour zone as was charged, because there was a truck in front of him and a car beside him as he was moving along in traffic. Raybine has provided no transcript of the proceedings in support of his appeal. Without a transcript, we must infer that the evidence before the court at hearing supported the court's findings that the speeding offense had been committed. *See State v. Nugent*, 2002 ME 111, ¶ 2, 801 A.2d 1001, 1002; M.R. App. P. 5(b)(2), (d), (f).
