## MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Brookfield Power US Holding America Co., the Merimil Limited Partnership, Hydro Kennebec LLC, and Brookfield White Pine Hydro LLC (collectively, Brookfield) appeal from a judgment entered by the Superior Court (Kennebec County, *Stokes, J.*) dismissing Brookfield's complaint against the Department of Marine Resources (DMR) and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). Brookfield's complaint sought declaratory and injunctive relief limiting DEP's and DMR's participation in an ongoing Federal Energy Regulatory Commission proceeding regarding relicensing for Brookfield's dam on the lower Kennebec River. Contrary to Brookfield's contentions, the trial court did not err in concluding that Brookfield's claims are not ripe for adjudication because "[a]ddressing the issues raised in Brookfield's complaint would directly entangle the court in the proceedings currently being conducted by federal and state administrative agencies." *See Blanchard v. Town of Bar Harbor*, 2019 ME 168, ¶¶ 17, 20-22, 221 A.3d 554.
