MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

George J. Stanley appeals from an adjudication by the District Court (Augusta, *Powers*, *A.R.J.*) determining that he committed a traffic infraction by failing to stop at a stop sign. *See* 29-A M.R.S. § 2057(7) (2024). Contrary to Stanley's arguments, we conclude that competent evidence from the record supports the court's finding, "by a preponderance of the evidence, each element of the charge," and the court did not err. *State v. Palmer*, 2017 ME 183, ¶ 7, 169 A.3d 425 (quotation marks omitted). Finally, we conclude that the traffic stop was constitutional. *See State v. Sasso*, 2016 ME 95, ¶¶ 7, 15, 143 A.3d 124.
