#### MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Steven Schoff Jr. appeals from a judgment of the Superior Court (York County, Brennan, J.) awarding Jay and Deborah O'Brien, parents of Devin personal representatives of his estate. \$160,023 O'Brien and compensatory damages and \$50,000 in punitive damages in this wrongful death action. Contrary to Schoff's contentions, the trial court did not abuse its discretion in awarding punitive damages, see Hanover Ins. Co. v. Hayward, 464 A.2d 156, 159 (Me. 1983), and Schoff's criminal conviction for the same conduct did not preclude the punitive damages award, see Tuttle v. Raymond, 494 A.2d 1353, 1356-57 (Me. 1985). In addition, the amount of punitive damages awarded was not clearly excessive. See Harris v. Soley, 2000 ME 150, ¶¶ 29-35, 756 A.2d 499, 508-10.
