MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Defendant Michael S. Bell appeals from a judgment entered in the Superior Court (Penobscot County, *Mead, J.*) following his conditional guilty plea to operating under the influence (Class D), 29-A M.R.S.A. § 2411 (1996). On appeal, defendant contends that the District Court (Bangor, *Gunther, J.*) erred in denying his motion to suppress evidence obtained during an investigatory stop. Contrary to defendant's contentions, the District Court did not err in finding an articulable suspicion that would justify the stop, *see State v. Dulac*, 600 A.2d 1121, 1123 (Me. 1992) and in finding probable cause to arrest him for operation under the influence. *See State v. Cilley*, 1998 ME 34, ¶ 11, 707 A.2d 79, 83.
