MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Joseph Campbell appeals from the judgment entered in the Superior Court (Penobscot County, *Marsano, J.*) following a jury verdict finding him guilty of unlawful sexual contact with penetration in violation of 17-A M.R.S.A. § 255(1)(C) & (3) (1983 & Supp. 2000). Contrary to Campbell's contentions, the evidence, when viewed in the light most favorable to the State, is such that a trier of fact rationally could have found beyond a reasonable doubt every element of the offense charged, *State v. Turner*, 2001 ME 44, ¶ 6, 766 A.2d 1025, 1027; the testimony of the victim, which is not "inherently improbable, incredible or lacking a measure of common sense" is sufficient to support the conviction. *See State v. Harper*, 675 A.2d 495, 497 (Me. 1996) (quoting *State v. Philbrick*, 551 A.2d 847, 852 (Me. 1988)).
