MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Thomas Wooldridge appeals from his conviction for theft (Class E), 17-A M.R.S.A. § 353 (1983), by the District Court (Biddeford, *Janelle, J.*). Wooldridge contends that: (1) he was subject to discriminatory treatment because of issues in his relations with the Biddeford Wal-Mart, a former employer; (2) he was denied assistance of counsel; and (3) that his shoplifting conviction was not supported by sufficient evidence. The evidence was sufficient to support the District Court's finding, beyond a reasonable doubt, that Wooldridge was guilty of shoplifting a stick of deodorant from Wal-Mart. The other issues asserted by Wooldridge were not properly presented to or preserved before the District Court.
