Cleaves Law Library has created a memorial fund as a way to commemorate the lives of members of the Maine legal community by assisting the library with its charitable, educational and historical purposes.

The fund was created in 2000 by the Board of Directors of the Library and is named the Nathan & Henry B. Cleaves Law Library Memorial Fund.

The South Portland law firm of Ainsworth & Thelin made the first gift to the fund in honor and memory of its late partner, William D. Pinansky, Esq. Mr. Pinansky's family also made a gift to the fund.

Public Commemoration

The library will commemorate William D. Pinansky and other persons who are memorialized in the future through contributions to the Memorial Fund, by placing their names on a plaque that is on display in the library.

Levels of Giving

Although gifts of every size are welcome, a Named Fund within the Memorial Fund may be established when donations total 10,000 or more.

A Named Fund may be established for a specific project or special purpose if donations total \$20,000.
